“Fall Foliage Liberty Tour” October 12-18, 2010

with host **Paul Warner**

Day One, October 12: Meet your hosts Paul and Karen Warner at the SLC airport to take a morning flight** to Manchester, NH. Upon arrival, board the motorcoach and drive to Salem—the home of the House of Seven Gables and the famous Witch Trials. Afterwards, on the way to your hotel, view the beautiful lights of downtown Boston as they reflect off the Harbor. Overnight for 4 nights.

Day Two, October 13: After breakfast at the hotel, the day will begin with a visit to John Adams National Park. Visit the homes where John and Abigail Adams lived and sacrificed for the freedoms we now enjoy. Conclude the day by boarding the Mayflower II and touring the Plimouth Plantation village. Here you will get to experience an original Thanksgiving Meal. (B)

Day Three, October 14: Today we will review the beginnings of the Revolutionary War by visiting Lexington and Concord. We will stand beside the famous Minuteman Statue to hear stories of the “shot heard round the world.” Your step on guide dresses in 1770's attire, will recount stories of this historical site. Afterwards, drive by the beautiful LDS Boston Temple before heading back to the hotel. (B)

Day Four, October 15: Spend the day in downtown Boston. Join the famous Boston Duck Tour on a WWII style amphibious landing vehicle. Cruise by all the places that make Boston the birthplace of freedom and a city of firsts, from the golden-domed State House to Bunker Hill and the TD Banknorth Garden, Boston Common and Copley Square to the Big Dig, Government Center to fashionable Newbury Street, Quincy Market to the Prudential Tower. After the big splash, you will take a walk on the Freedom Trail and learn of all the historical happenings that took place in this small part of Boston. You will also have time to sample the food at Quincy Market and visit Faneuil Hall. (B)

Day Five, October 16: This morning, depart the Boston area and head southwest towards the Big Apple. On the way visit the Mark Twain House & Museum in Hartford, CT. Here you will gain a new appreciation of the legacy of Mark Twain as one of our nation's defining cultural figures. Then on to New York for a city tour highlighting Harlem, Museum Mile, Central Park, Times Square, the Empire State Building, Greenwich Village, Lincoln Center, Grant's Tomb, St. Patrick's Cathedral and much more. After checking into your hotel, you will have free time to catch a Broadway Play, visit Times Square, shop 5th Ave. or wander Rockefeller Center. Overnight for 2 nights. (B)

Day Six, October 17: After a short church service at the hotel, you will have the chance to experience the humbling scene of Ground Zero. Your walking tour will be guided by a local with personal experience and stories of that tragic day in September 2001. After lunch, board the ferry that will take you to the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island. Immigrants who entered the US through the port of New York were legally and medically inspected at Ellis Island before being allowed to enter the country. (B)

Day Seven, October 18: Today we will view New York City from the observatory deck of the Empire State Building. Afterwards, you will have the day to explore the city on your own. You may choose to take in a matinee on Broadway, visit one of the many New York museums, visit St. Patrick's Cathedral, the LDS Temple or just roam Central Park. You will take a mid-afternoon shuttle to the airport for your flight home. (B)
